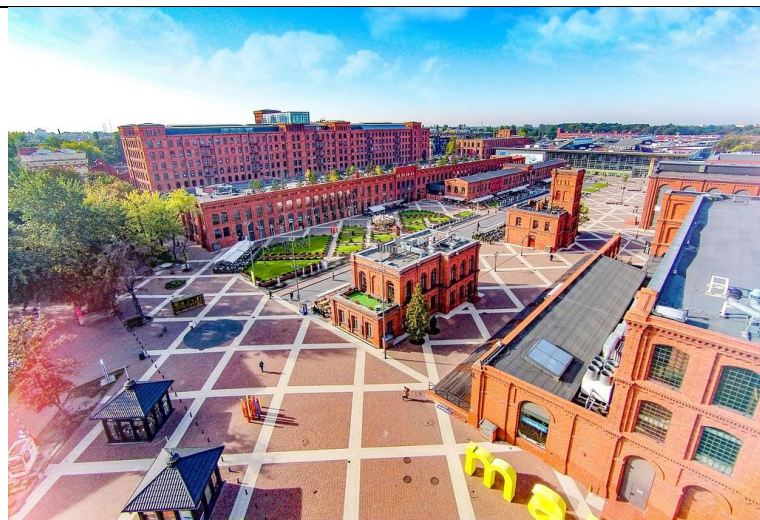

PLACE OF EVENT - Łódź, Poland

In the 20th century, Łódź was the centre of avant-garde art. Planning a stay in the city is similar to a creative process, limited only by imagination. So what is worth paying attention to?



Industrial heritage

Łódź was the most important centre of the textile industry in Poland. In the 21st century, the factories have gained new life: they became office buildings, creative spaces and tourist attractions. When visiting Łódź, see Manufaktura, EC-1 in the old power plant, Monopolis in the former distillery or Księży Młyn – a factory town within a city.



Film tradition

Łódź is the capital of Polish film. Many film studios operated in the city and many famous productions were shot on its streets. Walking around, it is easy to find places known from film frames. Most Polish actors were educated at the National Film School in Łódź. The only museum of cinematography in Poland is located in Łódź.



Murals

The fashion for murals started in Łódź in the second half of the 20th century. At that time, this form of applied art served as an advertisement for local factories. Today, Łódź is a place of street art, attracting artists from all over the world. They created an extraordinary gallery of several dozen works on the walls of buildings, enriching the urban space.



Culture

The only place where you can see the Central Museum of Textiles. The history of the city is presented through multimedia exhibitions in the Museum of the City of Łódź. Being a centre attracting artists for decades, Łódź has a Museum of Art, with three branches. Even Łódź University of Technology, specifically the Sports Bay, houses the Museum of Sport and Tourism.



Piotrkowska Street

The most important place in Łódź. Most of the city's pubs, restaurants and entertainment venues are located on Piotrkowska Street. The atmosphere of the street, built up with historic tenement houses of factory owners, can be felt especially during summer weekend evenings. Tourists and inhabitants spend them in pub gardens and the street is bustling and colourful. There is also OFF Piotrkowska, i.e. shops and gastro pubs in the old factory walls.

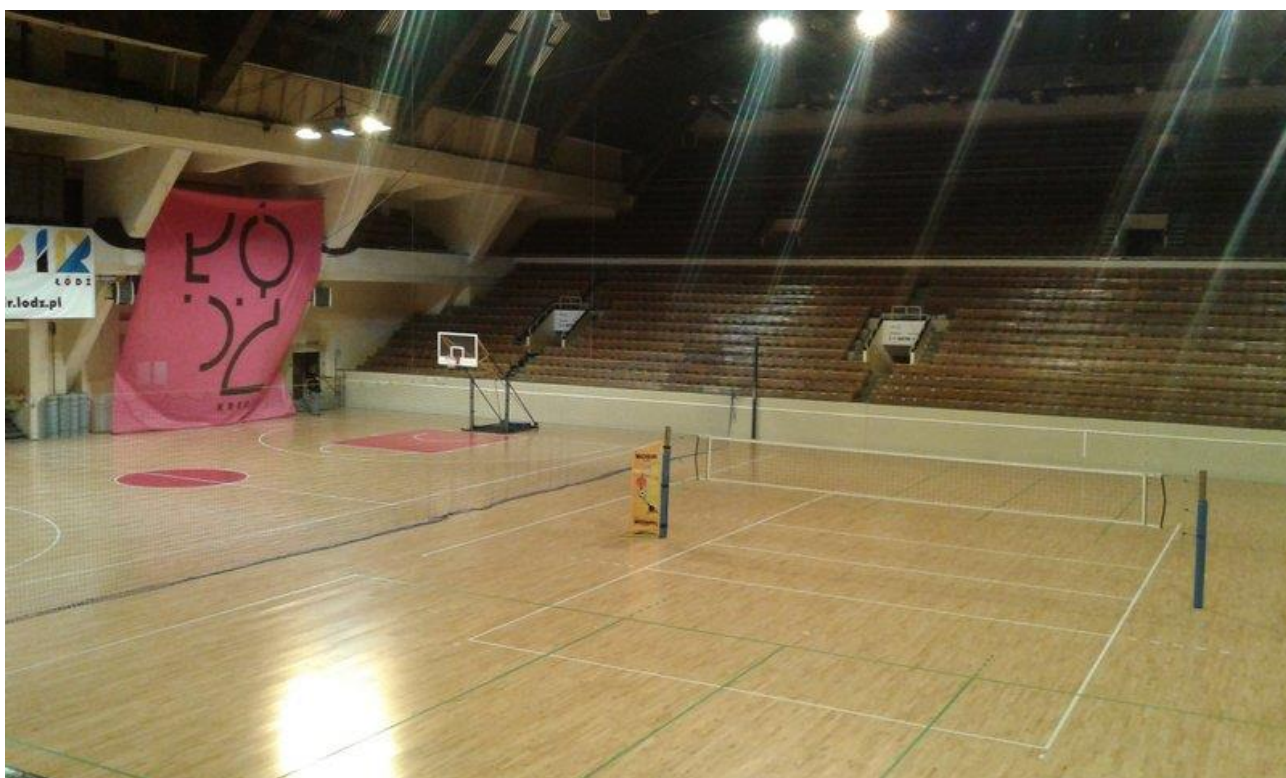

VERY IMPORTANT NOTE

Each national kickboxing federation (NKBF) should contact and co-operate with the National University Sports Association (NUSA) in the shortest time and agree on further cooperation and communication regarding the participation of kickboxers at the EUSA University Games - Łódź, Poland 2022.

QUALIFICATIONS FOR EUSA University Games- Łódź, Poland 2022

Each NKBF will, in cooperation with the NUSA, determine how the qualifications will be held. At national university qualifications in the foreseen disciplines and categories, students come as representatives of their faculties and as such they are running for appearance in the composition of their university sports team.

Qualifications can be held as separate qualifier tournaments for the EUSA University Games - Łódź, Poland 2022 or qualifications as part of national kickboxing championships - depending on the agreement between NKBF and NUSA.

NKBF will, in cooperation with the University Sports Federation and the NUSA, determine which kickboxers have acquired the right to participate at the EUSA University Games - Łódź, Poland 2022.

Each University can register an unlimited number of kickboxers in each category. Double start is possible in point fighting and kick light. On the EUSA University Games - Łódź, Poland 2022 can participate kickboxing teams from all the Universities from each country - WAKO members. On EUSA University Games - Łódź, Poland 2022 kickboxing teams represent University (not country or national team).

Referees

Referees for EUSA University Games - Łódź, Poland 2022 will be nominated by WAKO Europe Referee Committee - total 40 referees (6-PF, 16-KL, 8-K1, 8-FC + 2). Costs of travel and accommodation of referees will cover WAKO Europe and NKBFs.

THE RIGHT TO PARTICIPATE

The right to participate on the EUSA University Games - Łódź, Poland 2022 has students who meet the following criteria:

- They study at any University of the European countries regardless of degree of study
- They are studying at a faculty that is part of a university, regardless of whether the institution is public or private
- Former students who graduated in the academic year 2021/2022.
- Students who are between 17 and 30 years of age

The right to participate on EUSA University Games - Łódź, Poland 2022 has kickboxing teams from all of Europe's Universities operating in Europe regardless of whether they are EUSA members or not. The kickboxing team or kickboxers is entitled to participate only who are members of the NKBF who are members of WAKO Europe.

GENERAL ENTRY

This procedure may vary from country to country and should be defined by agreement between NKBF and NUSA.

A student - kickboxer who wishes to participate at the EUSA University Games - Łódź, Poland 2022 must contact the NKBF and the Student sports association the faculty / university where the student is studying. It is also possible for NKBF to report its members to a particular University Sports Association. In the event that the University does not have a student sports association, the student must contact the sporting person at the faculty / university where he or she is studying and NKBF.

After the University agreed and declares that the student - kickboxer or University kickboxing team will represent the University of the EUSA University Games - Łódź, Poland 2022 in kickboxing, the same through his student sports association or by a sports person sends a request to the NUSA to apply for the EUSA University Games - Łódź, Poland 2022 in kickboxing.

NUSA applies to the University Sports Team and to the EUSA online registration system. The system automatically sends a confirmation to the University that it has been registered for the EUSA University Games - Łódź, Poland 2022 in kickboxing and generates a deposit account in the amount of 200.00 €. After entering the general application, the person in front of the University receives user data and instructions for accessing the EUSA online registration system. Until the payment of the deposit the application is not deemed valid and cannot be resumed by entering a quantitative and nominal application.

The deadline for submitting a general application and payment of the deposit is 6 months before the start of the EUSA University Games - Łódź, Poland 2022 - January 15 2022.

TRAVEL PLAN

The deadline for submission of a detailed travel plan - date and time of arrival and departure, via the EUSA online registration system, is 1 month before the start of the EUSA University Games - Łódź, Poland 2022 - June 14 2022. The organizer is obliged to transport from the bus and train station and the airport to arrive and leave only for those who submitted the plan times.

ACCREDITATION

In order to obtain accreditation, participants must submit at the arrival:

- Confirmation of payment of all costs
- Certificate of Academic Eligibility or a copy of a diploma for students who have graduated
- Valid personal document (passport or identity card)

COSTS

The prize for the EUSA University Games - Łódź, Poland 2022 is 350,00 € per person (70 € / person / night).

EUSA registration fee is 30,00 € per person (the fee is paid before the participation, via the invoice generated by the system based on the number of registered persons).

The participants themselves bear the costs of medical, travel and other insurance.

NOTES

- The deadlines for registration may be changed in certain circumstances as decided by the organizer and EUSA.
- In each account generated by the system, payment information is provided and payable.
- Every university must report an official to the team, it is not possible for athletes representing a University to perform on their own.
- There is no way to sign up if the University does not want to apply to your student for competition or if the application is not submitted through the EUSA online registration system.

ARRIVALS

The traffic structure of the city of Łódź enables fast and safe arrival of the EUG 2022 participants by land, railway or air traffic and easy organization of the participants' transportation at the time of their arrival and departure, during the sports competitions and during participants' free time. Traffic terminals where the arrival and departure of the EUSA University Games - Łódź, Poland 2022 participants is expected:

Łódź Airport



Łódź Airport Central Poland (IATA: **LCJ**, ICAO: **EPLL**), formerly known as *Łódź-Lublinek Airport*, is a regional airport in central Poland, located approximately 6 km (3.7 mi) southwest of Łódź city center. Łódź ranked 8th among Polish airports in 2013 in passenger numbers. The airport has been in operation since 13 September 1925 and has recently undergone a number of upgrades, enabling it to handle services by low-cost airlines to destinations in Europe.

Main railway station in Łódź



Łódź Fabryczna is the largest and most modern railway station in the city of Łódź, Poland. It was originally constructed at the initiative of industrialist Karl Wilhelm Scheibler in 1865. In the old Polish classification of stations it was placed under the B category.

The station is located in the centre of Łódź. Trains depart frequently via Koluszki to Warszawa Wschodnia, Kraków, Częstochowa, and Tomaszów Mazowiecki. It was closed on 16 October 2011 as a part of a major redevelopment project to build a new railway station and transport interchange and reopened on 11 December 2016.

Bus station in Łódź



Flixbus serves Berlin, Prague, Warsaw, Wrocław, Gdansk, Katowice, Zakopane and Poznań. They offer free onboard Wi-Fi and the tickets should be bought online beforehand for the best price. Buses depart from Łódź Fabryczna bus station (adjacent to the train station).

Eurolines serves many European routes.

Small minibus and bus companies offer connections between Łódź and number of cities (big and small)

around Poland. While most of these depart from Łódź Fabryczna station, there are also buses (operated by **OKbus**) that go to Warsaw Chopin (Okęcie) and Warsaw Modlin airports from Łódź Kaliska station. The Czech bus company **Leoexpress** connects Łódź Fabryczna railway station with Warszawa Zachodnia bus terminal and Młociny metro station.

ACCOMODATION

Competitors and coaches: University dormitory
Officials and referees: TBD

Accommodation will be provided in the University dormitory. The rooms are mostly double with certain number of single rooms. Within the University dormitory on disposal are restaurants, pizzeria, cafeteria and a confectionery with a big terrace where catering for EUSA University Games - Łódź, Poland 2022 will be served.



The services available for participants in the Athletes' village are laundry service, gyms, meeting rooms, massage room, sport and fun zone, grocery store, ATM, info point, etc.

Accommodation

- Working hours (0-24)
- Persons per room (2 or 1)
- Exchanging towels, bed linen and room cleaning (on demand)
- Room standard (two towels, toilet paper, soap, blankets, pillows, bed sheets, closets, table, chairs, refrigerator)
- Internet (wi-fi and cable free of charge)
- Additional services (daily housekeeping, daily collection of waste disposal, daily maintenance service at disposal)
- Additional rooms (meeting rooms, lounge zone, gym, offices, massage room)
- Info point, security service and medical assistance available 0-24
- Laundry service within Village
- Accommodation rules will be published in every room (penalty in case of damage)

FOOD

Breakfast and dinner - student restaurant at university dormitory

Lunch - depending on the daily schedule or in the student restaurant or lunch packs in the sports hall

Catering

- Three meals per day and lunch packages on request
- Restaurants working hours will be confirmed upon completion of sport schedule
- Self-service system for athletes, volunteers and team officials; served food for referees, EUSA EC & TD and VIP guests in separated zone
- Each participating team/individual starts with lunch or dinner, depends on their arrival and ends with breakfast on their departure day

TRANSPORT

Transportation services from/to official welcome points during official competition days will be provided free of charge for all participants. The transportation from/to competition venue, training venue, catering and opening ceremony venue will not be needed thus all four facilities are in radius less than 100m from accommodation facilities.

Which form of transportation will be used during EUC depends on the target group of participants, frequency and duration of the journey, the flexibility and type of the means of transportation.
