#### Dear WAKO friends,

Last year was one of the best in the WAKO history.

Four continental championships were held (Asia, PanAmerica, Europe and Africa). All of these were in fact qualifying disciplines K-1 rules for the World Games 2017 in July in Wroclaw, Poland, where the WAKO is participating for the first time since its beginning.

I am especially pleased with the sudden increase in the number of the participating countries and the quality seen on the WAKO PanAm Championships 2016 (17 countries with over 850 athletes). I was present there and it was really nice to see Canada, Brazil, the USA, Mexico, Argentina, Chile etc. together.

I was also present on the WAKO Africa Championships in Morocco; yet, I have to say that I am not satisfied either with the number of the participating countries or the number of athletes.

However, this year we will do everything we can to pay more attention to the WAKO Africa, to try to raise quantity and organize more activities: seminars for referees and coaches, regular and various other competitions...

A large number of Cups were held in Europe and PanAm: 5 World and over 15 Continental Cups with more than 60 participating countries.

A lot was done on the sports-diplomatic field, too.

The WAKO delegation consisting of Espen Lund, Roy Baker and myself, was twice in Lausanne on the SportAccord Convention where we held meetings with the officials of the IOC, IWGA ( World Games), AIMS, WADA, FISU ( the International University Sports Federation), Peace&Sport...

We also visited the IOC headquarters in Lausanne upon the invitation of the IOC Sports Department and concerning the IOC recognition of the WAKO. We were received by a high IOC delegation. In WAKO delegation was also Mrs. Francesca Falsoni, WAKO Vice President and Chairman of the WAKO Legal Committee.

Another event in which we were delegates was the Conference of the International Fair Play Committee in Budapest. The WAKO became a member of this great international organization which is under the patronage of the IOC.

I was also present on the Peace and Sport International Forum in Monaco and we became partners and their members. So, we became full members and partners of these two great international sports federations.

In the first half of this year we are going to become members of the FISU ( the International University Sports Federation ) as well as of the International Working Group on Women and Sport (IWG). Everything is set for the signing of our membership in these two organizations which are the IOC partners.

I visited the Organising Committee of the World Games in Wroclaw, 5 national Olympic Committees in the world and held numerous meetings with the world sports officials concerning our membership in the IOC.

Clearly, the most important of all is the submission of our official Application for the IOC recognition in August, 2016.

In January, 2017, during the official visit to the IOC in Lausanne, we were assured that our Application is good (yet, there was a remark that we are expected to have more women in the managerial bodies and that the work of the Athlete and Coach Committee needs to be improved).

The meeting was held in a friendly atmosphere, and the WAKO was welcomed with appreciation and sympathies. It was agreed that the existing drawbacks be improved in a reasonable period, but we were also told that they are impressed with our quantity, the number of competitions, good organization and structure, as well as the popularity of kickboxing in the world.

We do expect and hope to become members of the IOC this year and thus make our long- lasting dream come true.

## **IOC headquarters**Laussanne, 12nd January 2017

## OPTIMISTIC MEETING WITH IOC REPRESENTATIVES



WAKO officials were on the de-brief meeting with the IOC in their HQ in Lausanne.

The representatives from IOC Sports Department were: Director Mr. Kit McConnell, Ms. Jenny Mann and Mr. Mike Joyce.

WAKO Delegation was: President Borislav Pelevic, Francesca Falsoni as WAKO Vice President and the Chairman of the WAKO Legal Committee, Espen Lund, WAKO Vice President and Chairman of the International Relations WAKO Committee and Roy Baker, WAKO Vice President and WAKO Europe Acting President.

The atmosphere of the meeting was very pleasant and it was obvious that WAKO has their sympathies.

We went through the application elements, both the strong elements, and improvements.

IOC was actually impressed with WAKO and our application, so we are in a very good state in many aspects and a step in front of many IFs, which are already a part of the IOC today.

We of course, know internally that we have many improvements in general, but it is important to absorb what's positive and to get the confidence that we move in the right direction.

Actually, the questions that we got concerning the "red flags" from the IOC, was actually not big issues and we will are already working on clarifications on such.

We can mention that they would see a plan to improve the gender balance more than now, even though we made some clarifications with what we

have already upgraded in our By-Laws.

We have to have more women in WAKO IF Board, knowing that situation now is only two women as the Board members. That gives the number less than 12 percents.

Their proposal is that WAKO IF Board has 40 % women. They expressed the possibility of adopting our plan and our WAKO Board decision to increase the number of women in the Board progressively in the near future (not just right now).

What is important, decision and the plan about that should be delivered.

The gender balance issue was the only serious issue we were discussing. All other issues they wanted to clarify were not so serious and WAKO can overcome them very easily.

They wanted to have some clarifications concerning Sustainability and we will summarize a bit what is facts today that can be seen as sustainable elements. Obviously, sustainability is not that a big and issue since we cannot be compared to many IFs that need special infrastructures to organize and develop their sports.

They wanted to know more about the educational aspects we conduct at the Championships, for which they already like. They liked the idea of the Coach and Athletes Committee's role as an important entourage factor.

It was asked for a breakdown in disciplines/countries and some other statistic issues. This was to mention some issues, not dramatic at all.

The application process is open and when we have delivered the new documents, we will get a confirmation and then we need to know when will Executive Board IOC handle new recommendations from the IOC Sports Departments.

We were told that it is very realistic that WAKO application for the IOC recognition would be discussed at the Executive Board meeting in July 2017.

The process is in good hands and WAKO have a full control of it.

Observing the worldwide development within sports, we experience that credibility is at stake on many levels. Education is everything and WAKO wants to strengthen its effort to promote Fair Play as an important educative tool within our movement. Our objective is that Fair Play will be a natural part of the behavior through activities, using best practices, cherish initiatives and create involvement and understanding. Fair Play enabled through actions is not only important for our athletes but also important for our entourage. So, let's have a goal to be best example using simple methods but yet creating important results".

Many great fights, huge energy and desire from all participating kickboxers to reach their place for Wroclaw. Unfortunately, there was no place for all of them. Only the best of the best got their tickets.

The WAKO will participate in the next edition of the IWGA World Games as an invitational sport represented by only one discipline, K1 rules. The decision about including kickboxing was made by the IWGA based on the popularity of the sport, especially its discipline K1 rules. It was recommended by Wroclaw Organizing Committee also in relation with the host country, Poland, which is very strong and successful in this exciting and world famous fighting sport.

The WAKO has great expectations from the IWGA World Games. For the first time ever, the WAKO will be able to show to this important World organization the real spirit of kickboxing. We are sure that great skills, exciting fights, high quality of our top kickboxers will make IWGA decide to accept the WAKO as a full member and kickboxing as an official sport for the future.

## WAKO PROGRAM FOR CHILDREN WITH SPECIAL NEEDS

## KICKBOXING FOR **BRIGHTER FUTURE** OF YOUNG PEOPLE



Every person, regardless of age, ability, economic advantage or any other criteria which make us different, has the right to participate in sport. Physical activity is the key to each individual's physical and mental well-being. All young people need to be given a chance to practice sport if they want to and to be able to take part in physical activities regardless of their ability or disability. There is a lot kickboxing can do for you whether you want to be a performance athlete or if you want to do it recreationally.

Sport has the power to develop young people's potentials, helping them to stay healthy and happy and be included in society. What is more, it is through sport that young people are motivated to contribute and to succeed. Sport also equips them with competence and prepares them for the challenges of life ahead. It gives young people support to develop positive personality traits: creativity, aspiration, resilience and empathy. Moreover, when it comes to children with special needs, sport is seen as one of the main factors that will support them and teach them how to boost their self-confidence.

During the WAKO European Championships in Maribor in October 2016, part of the program at the Opening ceremony was the demonstration of kickboxing by disabled children.

As part of the performance five boys between 15 and 18 came into the ring and exercised kickboxing. It was such a touching performance which truly, deeply saddened even the toughest of the hearts among the spectators. Yet, what is even more important is that it did a lot to show us, very bluntly, that everyone, no matter what their physical status is, has the right to do sport.

That was a great opportunity for the hosting country, Slovenia, and the main organizer, the five time WAKO



European champion and the five time WAKO World Champion, Tomaž Barada, to present the activities they have in the Barada Sports Center in Maribor concerning disabled kids. With specially educated trainers, these young people come to the gym every day and they get free kickboxing trainings. They learn basic kicks and punches and have a controlled sparring, which they enjoy the most. In the Barada Center experts in kickboxing conduct a special program approved by the highest profession authorities to train such kids.

Moreover, during the Championships Tomaz Barada ran an auction sale of the most valuable trophies and pieces of sports equipment he has earned throughout his extensive and prolific sports career. He planned to raise funds for charity programs concerning Slovenian athletes from less privileged backgrounds. Luckily, he sold his professional title belt to a big company in Slovenia. With this act he proved once again what a great man he is and that the most precious things in the world are not material. This is what he said when he handed over his belt: "If this money puts a smile on the children's faces in my Sports Center then I am a lucky man".

## A BELT FOR **HUMANITY**

To be a true WAKO champion sometimes it is not enough just to be the best fighter. It takes a lot more- a blend of skill, strength, humanity, altruism, care for others and good will.

We have had many examples of true champions finding the best way to immediatelly offer concrete funds for solving some problems in the community.

The WAKO and the WAKO PRO champion from Serbia, Nenad Pagonis, offered his WAKO PRO belt on an auction to help raise money for the victims of the floods in Serbia in 2014. The belt was bought by an NBA basketball star Darko Miličić, who was so pleasantly surprised by the WAKO people he met on that occasion. So much that he started to practice kickboxing once he had finished his NBA carreer. A year afterwards, he asked the WAKO PRO headquaters for a professional fight.

On the press conference before the event, Nenad Pagonis was there to give him support with the words: "You bought my belt, now the time has come for you to earn yours!"

There are many examples of human acts when champions show readiness to help the disabled.

On the last European
Championships in Maribor in October
2016, one of the organizers of this
event, Tomaž Barada, a multiple
WAKO European and World
Champion, also offered his belt on an
auction with the aim of helping
children who need assistance in
everyday life or the ones who live in
poverty.

On the Final evening ceremony, Barada sold his belt to a big company in Slovenia, with the purpose of donating money. This event was used to increase visibility of the burning problem of the lack of support for children in their growth,



disabled children and young people who are missing out on their childhood because of the inappropriate equipment, and the lack of opportunities to be included in the community.

"I am sure that the belt is now in good hands", said Tomaž Barada after the handover. "I would like to thank the Slovenian Lottery greatly for helping to provide what is needed for children in Slovenia."

# WAKO AT SPORTACCORD IF FORUM

Lausanne was a real epicenter of World's Sport from 9-11 November 2016, where Annual SportAccord International Federations (IF) Forum 2016 was held at the Royal Savoy Hotel.

This was the 10th edition of an IF Forum held with the topic The Power of Sport to Drive World Health, which provided various platforms for International Federations to discuss key challenges and gain from the insights of major leaders and stakeholders from the sport and the industry.

This edition was a historic one with the IOC President Dr. Thomas Bach, Mr. Francesco Ricci Bitti, the SportAccord Convention President and the ASOIF President (the Association of the Summer Olympic International Federations) and the SportAccord President Mr. Patrick Baumann opening the IF Forum, showing the unity between the IOC and SportAccord and SportAccord Convention.

Representatives and delegates from more than 180 International Sports Federations were present on the Forum.

The WAKO was represented by its President, Dr. Borislav Pelević, and the Vice President, Mr. Espen Lund, who is also the President of the WAKO Committee for International Relations.

#### **IOC APPLICATION**

Undoubtedly, the most important meeting for the WAKO was with Mr. Mike Joyce, from the IOC Sports Department.

The process of the IOC recognition of the WAKO is ongoing.

For sure the WAKO has submitted a strong application. What is more, the WAKO is a big international federation compared to many of the IFs in the AIMS. We got confirmations from the

ARISF President, Mr.Raffaele Chiulli, a supporter of the WAKO, that our application is in compliance with all the IOC standards.

#### **SPORTACCORD COMBAT GAMES**

There was a meeting held with all the presidents and delegates of combat sports organizations concerning Combat Games.

It was decided that a new edition of Combat Games be held in March/April 2018. As of now we have two candidates to host Combat Games: Huston, Texas, the USA ,and Almaty, Kazakhstan. All details will be defined on the next SportAccord meeting in Denmark, April 2017.

#### **MEETING WITH FISU**

WAKO delegates had a meeting with Mr. Paulo Ferreira, the Director of the World University Championships, concerning the recognition process.

The situation is following: the FISU will finalize the process of application in January 2017. The WAKO will be sent the questionnaire and will have one month to submit the application. Then it will

be assessed. Hopefully, if everything goes as planned, the WAKO will sign an agreement with them on the next SportAccord Convention in Denmark in April.

Once the WAKO is recognized by the FISU it will get a patronage for the world or local championships including access to their network. Last but not least, the WAKO will be included in the combat sports cluster for the University Combat Games in 2020.

#### MEETING PEACE AND SPORT

WAKO delegates had an important meeting with the President of the International Organization PEACE AND SPORT Mr. Joël Bouzou.

PEACE AND SPORT is an organization under the patronage of the UN and the UNHCR.

The WAKO already has common activities with this organization in Jordan, where Dr. Basel helped, together with this organization, refugee camps. PEACE AND SPORT highly appreciates the efforts the WAKO has put helping the ones in need in Jordan.

## ESPEN LUND'S MEETING WITH THE DEPUTY DIRECTOR GENERAL IN THE IOC

While Mr. Espen Lund was at the IOC Headquarter meeting his marketing colleagues he also had a constructive meeting with the Deputy Director General in the IOC, Mr. Pere Miro. They carried out productive one-hour talks in his office on various issues, especially about social inclusion.

With 480 participants from 33 countries, the WAKO continues to prove how big an organization in Europe it really is. All the participants from the first part of the Championships held in Maribor, Slovenia, and from the second part in Greece combined comprise more than 1000 entries on the European Championships in 2016.

The opening ceremony was held on November 22. It started at 11 o'clock and was again a great showcase of strength, unity and dignity of the WAKO.

## EUROPEAN CHAMPIONSHIPS FOR **2016** (Second part)



Point fighting men's ranking on these championships didn't bring any big surprises: category -84kg and -89 kg was superiorly reserved for Morady Zsolt (Hun) and Roman Brundl (Aut), two old champions, two rivals in the open category and great fighters. German team had two first places in men division, Sarantoudis Timmy in -69kg and Kuschnir Anatoli -94kg. Italian Riccardo Albaneze strongly holds the title in -79kg and Colla David in -63kg. The Hungarians are the best in the light and the heaviest categories: Jaroszkiewicz Krisztian was the best in +94kg and young Veres Roland earned the title of the best male fighter on the championships. The interesting thing is that Veres Roland was the best in kick-light and in -57kg category too!

Point fighting team competition is all about adrenaline flow. That's for sure. This time, Hungarian team was the best and deserved the gold medal. The second place went to the WAKO Italian team and the third to Irish team.

Besides the participation of great, confirmed champions and legends of the WAKO, fighters like Zsolt Moradi, Roman Brundl, McMenamy Robbie, Szabo Dorina, to name just a few, there were also newcomers who participated in the European Championships for the first time. This was certainly inspiring for all of them.

The hardest discipline and the category with tough competition was for sure Full contact men -71kg with the biggest number of registered participants.

In fierce competition the finals introduced two great fighters and a fantastic final fight: Konikov Iurii (Russian Kickboxing Federation) beat Hristo Hristov from Bulgaria. Another great fight was in -81kg full contact between Carrasco Montero Carlos Manuel (Spain) and a great Russian fighter, Nurmaganbetov Kayrat, who won the gold.

Three days of elimination fights were very well organized and everybody was excited about the finals.

In total, medals statistics is as follows:

Three best nations are:

- 1. Russia (19 gold, 8 silver, 6 bronze-total 33)
- 2. Hungary (9 gold, 5 silver, 2 bronze total 16)
- 3. Italy (5 gold, 9 silver, 13 bronze total 27)

It was a fantastic success for the Russians: out of 39 participants on the Championships, they brought home 33 medals, which is 84%.

In musical forms all gold medals went to Russian fighters. Russian anthem was played 8 times during the awarding ceremony thanks to these amazing athletes: Gavrilov Denis, Bagautdinov Linar, Derunov Vadim, Baev Ivan, Koptova Angelina, Samygina Anna (two gold in two divisions), and Belychenko Anastasia.

Europe got new Champions and they will go home inspired to train even harder, remembering the great event but more importantly looking forward to the positive future of the sport of kickboxing.

Georgian Cimpeanu, an Italian fighter, is an extraordinary athlete who has managed to unite good will and self-sacrifice. A 15- time Italian Champion, a 20- time winner of the Cup Best Fighter, a 6- time champion on the Austrian Classics, a World champion, junior and senior divisions in point fighting, light contact, kick light. He tried his luck on European Championships in Maribor, in light contact -

She was luckier in kick light in which she was better than Gremen Petra (Hungary)in the finals, but in point fighting, she was not able to defeat the new European champion Gullotti Luisa from Italy. Taking into account her participation on the first part of the Championships, where she was in Light contact -60kg and won gold medal, there is no doubt that she is one of the most successful athletes this year on the Europeans with three medals around her neck. Consequetely, she was awarded the best female fighter of the European Championships.

The WAKO IF General Assembly 2016 was also held in Loutraki. Our main aim is to create a bright future for our sport and our Athletes and Entourage. All the participants showed great enthusiasm and unity towards future duties and work concerning the IOC recognition application and all the aspects of improvement of work within the WAKO.

The promoter of the Championships, the President of the WAKO Greece, Mr. Mike Triantafillou has done a great job with his staff for realizing this event and he doesn't hide his happiness for bringing kickboxing Championships back to Greece.

"WAKO Europe is delighted to see continued evolution of the kickboxing sport worldwide.

The second part of the Europeans is the example of strength of the sport of kickboxing in Europe. We have over 1,000 participants in total taking part in the Championships 2016 in Europe. We successfully prepared fair, clean and empowering environment for all participants. 
It was the biggest PanAmerican

"For now, we have more than 700 athletes from 15 countries and we are sure that this number will rise. The tactic defined by the WAKO PANAM board is achieving great results. ## **Datsi Datsiev**

- Honored Master of Sports, a six-time Champion of Russia, a World Champion, a two-time European Champion in kickboxing, K-1.



## 1. Can you, please, introduce yourself:

I am 27 years old. I live in Russia, in Saratov city. I do sports. The main thing in my life is kickboxing, and I also enjoy football, paintball, swimming.

## 2. How and when did you start kickboxing? I have been doing kickboxing since 2008.

## 3. What are your biggest achievements in kickboxing?

My biggest achievements are when I became a six-time Russian Champion, a World Champion, and a two-time European Champion. In the final fight on the European Championships K1 in Maribor in weight up to 75 kg, I defeated the representative of Bulgaria, Sergey Aleksandrov. That was one of the hardest fights I had had in my career. There are no weak opponents on the Europeans. We were fighting for the qualifications on the prestigious The World Games. There in Wroclaw, I expect a high level of organization, tough fights and above all, an attractive show for the audience all around the world.



The governor of Saratov region, Valery Radayev, honoured Datsi Datsiev with the award Master of Sports Russia kickboxing on January 12, 2017 and his coach Rasul Dalgatov was honoured with the award Coach of Russia.

## A WOLF IN THE RING

He is a qualified fighter for The World Games 2017 in Wroclaw, gaining a gold medal - 75kg on the European Championships in Maribor 2016.



In sports, you always have to move forward. I see myself as a pro fighter in the future. Last year I signed a contract with ACB promotional company and it can change the course of my sports career. It is a prestigious company, a league which holds very serious tournaments.

## 4. What is your main discipline in kickboxing? K1.

## 5. Is it easier to be in an amateur or a professional league?

In an amateur since you never know who you will meet next time in the ring, you must be ready for any opponent. Injuries are more often in the preparation time and during the Championships. In the professional league, your opponent is known a few months earlier, you have time to inspect his way of fighting, to study his technique, favorite techniques, basic kicks, etc. You are more focused on the person and preparation program is way different. But, remember that your opponent is studying you at the same time and in the same way.

Nevertheless, you should never underestimate your opponent. Whoever it is.

But, the feeling you have at the beginning of your amateur athlete career when you have the joy of victory running through your veins, can't be replaced with anything else.

### 6. What were the most difficult things in your career?

When I lost the Championship of Russia, I didn't qualify for the World Cup. At that period of my life, I was supported by relatives and my coach. Another sportsman, who went to the World Championship was defeated . But suspension from the championship did not break me. I began to work harder and achieved goals. The following year, I took part in the competition of the Russian Championship and left no chance to the rivals. I won and passed the selection for the European Championship, where in 2014 I was the first. After that, on the





international scene, I did not lose a fight. Since then I have been the captain of the Russian team.

### 7. How do you train? Can you describe a typical day, please?

I have light jogging or swimming at 6 o'clock in the morning, I alternate running with swimming. At 11 a.m. - a morning workout at the gym, which includes sparring, working in pairs, practising techniques which help me be prepared for fights. During the evening training at 5 p.m. I have a cross for 5 km and then training with a personal trainer.

When I am preparing for the Championship I have a hard schedule of the day. Three times a day I workout at the gym, and in addition I go swimming and running. I haven't got enough time for anything else except for sleeping at night.

## 8. Is your family happy about your success in kickboxing?

My family, my parents, my wife fully support me throughout my wins and defeats. They are always with me. But they always worry about me, especially when I'm in the ring. They are afraid of injuries. The female part of my family cannot bear to see my injuries and try to force me to stop. But the male part of my family push me to move forward. My family is my main pillar. My family is my main support. It is a great feeling when you come home as a winner.

## 9. Are there any differences between training kickboxing in Russia and in the rest of Europe?

Of course, there are some differences. Russia is a big, multinational country. It's difficult to determine the abilities of fighters from the whole country. That's why in Russia it is said that to win the championship of Russia it is harder than the World Championship. Russia has many regions, and each region sends their best fighters to competitions. In each weight category, there are 4 fights at least. As you can see, there is a very strong competition. Everyone wants to prove that he is number one in Russia. In my opinion, kickboxing schools in Russia are of high quality and it's proven in championships. Senior coaches of the Russian national team have achieved great results, not only in coaching, but each of them has perfect results as athletes. Kickboxing is very popular in Russia and, accordingly, is highly developed.

## 10. Russia is No.1. in the world in our sport. What is your recipe for success?

My recipe - to defeat, to move forward and achieve goals despite the pain. This is the only way, there is no other. It is important to have stability, perseverance, willpower. Your environment is really important. It is only among strong personalities that you become strong. In the future, if it is possible, I would like to open a children's sports school, to train children, to teach them what I have learned. I want to promote sport and a healthy lifestyle. Children are our future, our next

## 1. Who is Tim in kickboxing?

Tim Mazurkiewicz, the Head of officials for WAKOUSA, North America and Pan America for WAKO IF. I am international A class official, WAKOPRO Official and a Board Member of the WAKO IF Ring Sports Committee.

## 3. Which was harder to do: to be a competitor, a fighter or now to be a judge?

I think the second one, to be a judge. There are so many differences between different cities, countries and language barriers. There is also the political side of our work as well so, it is hard for a lot of people to collectively stay neutral. I remember an occasion when I was approached by a coach before one World championship fight and was attempted to be bribed \$5,000 Euros to help ensure his son a victory. For me it was an easy decision to turn this down and make the right choice. We have to make the right choice for the future of our sport.

## 4. What are the main challenges now for referees and judges in kickboxing?

The biggest challenge for us stateside is getting new judges more opportunities of experience. Rob Zbilski is doing a great job with growing kickboxing in the USA and more opportunities are opening up daily for them.

Strong organization has to take care about the professional league of judges and referees. I wanted to start an officials ranking system in the USA. So as I am developing our officials, we can rank them and they can get opportunities to travel to international competitions







### 2. Did you ever tasted the sport with the gloves on?

A little bit: I was in the sport as a competitor some time of my life, 20 + years and I was Golden Glove Boxing Champion, Tough Man Champion, 10x USA Kickboxing Champion, Kickboxing World champion, Heavyweight representative of TEAM USA when Rob Zbilski was our coach, and now he is the President of WAKO USA. He was taking us to travel and fight overseas then, I took some time off from the sport to raise my family and develop my business. I am back involved in the USA trying to help to develop our sport... Myself, I was a Full contact fighter so still I enjoy full contact fighting the most

based on their professionalism, knowledge of the rules and activity. This platform will give the new officials the goal to strike for and also be able to selectively bring the top officials from our country... now if we can implement worldwide, where each of the countries of WAKO has the official ranking system where we can go through, and the officials can be ranked by the same criteria. That will bring the officiating level up to the highest level that it needs to be. Another hurdle is that a lot of countries do not have the finances to be able to send their officials to the championships. People have to take a time from work to come on the competition.

## 5. What can you say about your WAKO PRO judging career?

It has been amazing. It allows me to travel the World and have a front row seat to see the best kickboxing fighters in the world. It has been my honor to be selected as one of the best in the World.

## 6. How is kickboxing doing now in America?

Our First North American Championships were great, in coalition with UFC Fight Week, so it was in a very large venue. They were very impressed with our professionalism, our tournament was in true WAKO Championship form. Our championships in July host the west coast and east coast regional qualifiers. There people can qualify to come to the National championships. We hold our National championships at the tournament as the team qualifier for the Pan American championships as well. We returned in 2016 in coalition once again with the UFC, this time with the help of **Raymond Daniels** and **Jarrett Lieker** we added Tatami, creating an amazing event! We are excited about the continued growth of WAKO kickboxing in the USA.

7. How can you motivate fighters in the USA to stay in WAKO amateur kickboxing, to sacrifice great time of their lives for true medals and valuable titles, to resist to instant offers like: become a World champion in two months, what is popular nowadays?

As we expose through our media more of what WAKO is, the only TRUE World Kickboxing Championships. When real fighters see this level of competition they know instantly that the other titles are basically meaningless. I would give up all of my Title Belts for one WAKO World Championship.

## 8. Do Americans love tatami disciplines and are they popular in the USA?

Yes, Americans love Tatami. But with all the different organizations within the USA, the people are diversely spread out.

Appointing **Raymond Daniels** as to the Head of Tatami, has definitely helped grow WAKO with in the USA.

## 9. Will you judge on The World Games in Wroclaw this year? What are your expectations about that event?

I am excited and honored to be selected as one of the Best Officials in the world for this momentous occasion. I am excited to be part of history! This is a true testament to the progression of our sport and that the Olympics will be soon to come for WAKO.

I am of Polish decent, so I am very excited to bring my family for the event to meet my many relatives for the first time.

## 10. What can you say about your private life? You have a big family?

I am 44 years old and married almost 20 years to my beautiful wife Angie. I have five children, aging from 21, 16, 12, 8 and 5. They are in many different sports: from American football, soccer, basketball, wrestling, baseball and jujutsu. My youngest two say they would like to do kickboxing when they grow up. I coach many of my children's sports teams, own a construction company and am involved in local politics. I am very much active, don't you think?

## → 11. How do you judge the millennium generation? Do they have the chances that we had when we were growing?

The future generation has many more opportunities than we did. By the touch of a button they have so much



knowledge at their access. Now only if they use that positively, and do not let the ease of access create lazy habits, will they succeed. I have big expectations as they are our future world leaders and sport brings people together as one. The World Games and Olympics are tremendous life goals to strive for...

## 12. You enjoy traveling to Russia and we see that many Russians are your friends. How do you feel about your last trip to Russia on 2016 Moscow Russia WAKOPRO K-1 World Title?

It was an incredible event, thank you again to Vadim Ukraintsev for bringing me to your most beautiful country. I had the opportunity to meet **Stephen Segal**, an American famous actor, as he sat next to me ringside. The WAKO PRO K-1 Title bout was again in typical WAKO form, AMAZING! The bouts were held at the Russian Olympic Stadium. It is hard to explain in one paragraph the event they organized. I can only classify it as World Class. I was impressed to the highest level. Now if only our governments could get along so well...

## 13. You truly enjoy being the part of the WAKO?

I would like to finish by saying it is truly my honor to be involved with such great people from around the World that share the love of Kickboxing as I do. I look forward to our continued growth of our sport as we push to achieve our ultimate goal of becoming an Olympic Sport.

Organized in association with WAKO and the PAN-HELLENIC FEDERATION OF KICKBOXING "POK", Athens Challenge Tournament is without a doubt the biggest Kick Boxing event in Greece.

Athens Challenge Tournament is one of the top 5 Kick Boxing events across Europe where each year athletes compete in Kick Boxing disciplines: Point Fighting, Light Contact, Kick Light, Low Kick, forms hard style, soft style, weapons and in Self-defense.

This edition 2017 brought over 1220 European athletes from 12 countries such as Austria,



Belgium, Bulgaria, Germany, Greece, Hungary, Ireland, Italy, Russian Federation, Spain, United Kingdom, Georgia who were competing in 2151 entries. Only Greece had more than 1400 entries. The second in entries was Italy (271) and Bulgaria (137).



## E- learning in the WAKO Integrity e-learning

In the process of incorporating and standardizing activities with International sports organizations where WAKO has membership, one of the tools in the modern environment for educating members is having the Integrity e-learning modules. WAKO accepted all international rules and regulations which arranges the sports environment in all levels.

Integrity policy means understanding all unethical behavior that can be related to sports.

In order to ensure Fair Play in sport WAKO outline guidelines in order to inform, prevent and react towards unethical behavior. This is a complex situation, but we all have to stay opened for all information needed to be protected from suspicious behavior. Match-fixing violates the pillar of Fair Play in sport and to act clean is something that WAKO needs to build as a part of the culture, and prevention of possible challenges never ends.

Any official, athlete or direct participant in the kickboxing community found to be committing offenses which are considered as unethical behavior, faces the possibility of disqualification, disciplinary action, legal action and investigation.

WAKO E-Learning modules considers all aspects of : How to Prevent Match-fixing, Betting and Manipulation from destroying your career or others career. This is a short program, but it may be the most important time you spend to guard your career. Match fixing and manipulation is a growing problem in sports.

The pilot integrity program is launched and anybody can find it on the WAKO web site. From now on, it is

considered as mandatory to all national athletes, referees, coaches and officials.

By viewing this program everybody will gain information to keep him/herself safe and protect your sport from corruption. You will learn about the behavior everybody must adopt towards sports betting and about the dangers of match-fixing to sport career, reputation and even life.

Most of all, you will learn and be introduced to the challenge related to manipulation and how certain behavior can and will change the outcome of a match.

It is expected you will take about 45 minutes to go through the program. At the end, everybody must answer some questions in order to obtain WAKO Integrity Certificate for which WAKO will send all who passed the test.

## WHAT IS CONSIDERED AS MANIPULATION, MATCH FIXING OR ILLEGAL BETTING IN SPORT?

- When an athlete, official or other stakeholder in team engages in all ways in betting or gambling when his/her sport or event or team is in competition.
- When an athlete doesn't perform in accordance of his/her best abilities on competition in exchange for money, gift or other way of compensation or reward.
- When an athlete, official or other stakeholder in team instructs or enables another party to bet or gamble on a sport event or competition to which he/she is personally involved.
- When an athlete, official or other stakeholder ensures that the sport event will take place, and for that he/she receives money or gift compensation.
- When an athlete, official or other stakeholder receives money or gift or any kind of compensation in the contest which is obvious that brings the sport or athlete into disrepute.
- When an athlete, official or other stakeholder uses any kind of "inside

- information" which can be used for abusing the rules of Fair Play and for that receives money/gift/reward.
- When an athlete, official or other stakeholder does not provide relevant information to the competent sport authority regarding any approach, invitation or engagement in incidents that would take to illegal match fixing and betting.
- When an athlete, official of other stakeholder doesn't cooperate in the investigations carried out by the International organization or other Governmental authorities concerning manipulations in sport.
- When an athlete, official or other stakeholder knowingly assists, covers up or induces and supports other parties to commit any of listed offences.

## Struggle against match fixing, sport betting and drug abuse in sports

## EDUCATION AGAINST MANIPULATIONS IN SPORT

According to the new WAKO By-laws, from this year WAKO requires this procedure as mandatory for everybody involved in World and Continental Championships.

This means that all members of national team, international referees and officials of National Federations has to fill in the questionnaire that can be found on the official WAKO web site.

Education is very important for all of us, in order to work effectively against Match Fixing, Sports Betting, Manipulation and raise awareness about Integrity on many levels of our organization.

In organized sports, Match fixing occurs as a match is played to a completely or partially pre-determined result, violating the rules of the game and often the law. In Match fixing the winner and loser are decided in advance by agreement of the competitors or related people.

In addition to the match fixing that is committed by players, coaches and/or team officials, it is not unheard of to have results manipulated by corrupt referees.

Since 2004, separate scandals have erupted in prominent sports leagues in Portugal, Germany (Bundes league scandal), Brazil (Brazilian football match-fixing scandal) and the United States (Tim Donaghy scandal), all

of which concerned referees who fixed matches for gamblers. Many sports journalists have speculated that in leagues with high player salaries, it is far more likely for a referee to become corrupt since their pay in such competitions is usually much less than that of the players.

Sports betting is the activity of predicting sports results and placing a wager on the outcome. Sports bettors place their wagers either legally, through a bookmaker/sports book, or illegally through privately run enterprises referred to as "bookies". Wage brokers both legal and illegal make a profit by taking a percentage of all money bet. Sports betting has resulted in a number of scandals in sport, even in many European countries bookmaking (the profession of accepting sports wagers) is regulated but not criminalized.

Sports betting and match fixing in many occasions goes hand by hand.

To raise awareness about the fact that Match fixing, illegal sport betting and manipulation in sport are destroying the sport and people involved in it, it is crucially important for the society to preventively learn about all methods that can pull in the person in to illegal activities.

The Singapore businessman Dan Tan has been arrested 2015 on suspicion of coordinating a global football match-fixing syndicate.

Tan was jailed after Italian prosecutors accused him of being the mastermind of a global crime syndicate that made millions of dollars betting on rigged Italian matches and other games across the world. He stood behind dozens of fixed matches in Italy's top three divisions and leading a fixing ring stretching as far as South America that was allegedly in operation for more than 10 years.

He is also being tried in absentia by a Hungarian court for allegedly manipulating 32 games in Hungary, Italy and Finland. We've had match-fixing in cricket, professional wrestling, football, basketball, and snooker, corruption in football, and doping in cycling, rugby, baseball and athletics.

Now it's the turn of tennis – and back to fixing matches. Why would people who have worked so hard to reach such heights risk everything for a fast buck?

The money involved is not insignificant, of course. According to the Buzz feed - BBC report, players were offered \$50,000 or more per fix.

Novak Djoković says he once turned down \$200,000 to lose a match early in his career.

However, for a lesser player whose career is waning, the offer of a five- or six-figure sum, possibly repeated several times a year, would look much more tempting: a nice earner before hanging up your racket.

So, if the financial incentive to cheat could be attractive for some, what about the risks?


Taking drugs: for example, why US athlete Marion Jones resorted to steroids very early in her career when most experts agree she could have won Olympic medals without them.

When she was interviewed on the Oprah Winfrey Show, after spending six months in prison for lying under oath about using performance-enhancing drugs, she tearfully persisted with a claim that her coach had originally told her the tablets were flaxseed oil.

Betting: Betting may be legal, but perhaps it's time to ask if it is bound to corrode the integrity of sport itself.
